## Supplies needed:

- Scroll Saw... nothing fancy, I have an inexpensive 16 inch craftsman (under \$150.00)
- Wood... I use soft pine works quick and easy, thickness depending on project...I use 3/4 inch for the figures
- Drill...again, the less expensive one is fine. I just use the sanding bit to do the edges...and sometimes the drill bit to make holes
- Spray adhesive... spray the wood then place patterns on it, then cover with postage tape
- Postage Tape...its fine just to cut with the tape right over the pattern it actually helps keep the blades sharp.

Spray wood, add pattern, cover with tape, & cut



- Sandpaper...hardly use... just to give the projects a quick sanding before painting
- Paint or Stains... You can use whatever you like. I would obviously use non toxic ones if you are making toys for children. Depending on project I use the inexpensive acrylic paint watered down or watercolors. Some non-toxic paint websites are:

- Finishes...because I have really little ones I use the recipe of a beeswax and canola oil paste...slather it on and let sit for a few hours and then polish off...but of course play and find what works for you.

Added note, remember to cut the bottoms of the projects straight if they are to stand up...or you can cut out a very easy base (you can even use 1/4 inch wood) and glue it to make figure stationary for nature tables and such.

Remember you can **enlarge** or **reduce** the images using your computer
